



# "The Playing of God"

Basketmaking is one of the oldest and most widespread crafts on earth and various techniques have developed over 9000 years. In various parts of the world it has been used to make walls, doors and roofs of houses, rafts and sails, fish traps and nets. No satisfactory automatic system has yet been found, basketry is still a skilled handicraft.

Most British willow is grown in Somerset, three grades are available; green rods (for cheap baskets); brown rods which are cut during the winter; best grade white rods, cut when the sap is still rising in the plant.

Brown rods are cut during the winter and stacked away from the damp. White rods are cut in the spring and are stacked in water to keep them supple for later peeling; and are the best seasoned and used for most basket work. Brown rods are not peeled.

The birch-broom, or besom, to give it its correct name is of Saxon origin and has remained unaltered to this day. It is made up of birch cuttings for a head, bound together with strips of wire, wood or other material, with a short ash stick thrust into it to serve as a handle. Some of the moorland districts of England and Wales use wild heather or broom which grow in abundance in these areas.

The birch cuttings are taken only from trees which are seven years or older, younger trees have too fine and thin a crown. For seasoning, cuttings are laid out in a stack which is finished with a ridge-like roof like a haystack. They are left until the following spring when they are opened up and the bundles taken out as required

The maker picks up an armful of cuttings, knowing by experience just how many he needs for each head, after arranging them to his satisfaction, he binds them very tightly in two places. The base is then chopped clean and the ash handle inserted.



formerly thatching was made of straw, reeds, heather, gorse and bracken. If straws were used the best were those made of wheat and rye, oat and barley being rather softer and liable to absorp water.

Reeds are superior to any straw thatch, and well laid, can last for half a century, whereas straw lasts not much

more than 3C years.

Heather or ling used to be used for thatching ornamental summer houses etc.and good ones have been known to last ICC years, but heather is much heavier than straw or reed and therefore needs a much stronger underlying construction. The pitch of a thatched roof is always steep to provide a good run off for water.





Carpentry in its true sense, is hand work requiring a great deal of knowledge not necessary to a machine operator. He must know how to build up a given structure or article, how to arrange the pieces composing it; how the grain of each piece must run; what kind of joints are best and what other means are necessary for holding the parts together - such as nails, screws bolts etc. . In early times his job would have included that of the wheelwright.

Very early wheels were solid discs of wood, or made from pieces of wood fastened together and then cut into a circular shape. The timber used in most carriage wheels was wych elm for the hubs, oak for spokes and ash

for the felloes (parts of the rim).

The art of brickmaking is an ancient one apparently originating in Egypt and introduced into Britain when the Romans settled here. However they were not used by the English much until Tudor times. Then ornamental use of brickwork reached it's height.


In the early twentieth century there were, still, a number of hand-made brick businesses on the outskirts of London though by then most bricks were machine cut. Clay was dug in winter and mixed with ashes to break it up.an expert moulder with a boy assistant could make IOOO bricks a day clay was thrown into a wooden mould, trimmed then placed under wooden covers in the open to dry, before being placed in clamps for firing.





much pottery was, and still is in primitive societies of the world, done by women who require vessels for their own use. Some primitive practices suggest that closely plaited basketware was smeared with clay either inside or out, then through accidental contact with hearth fires, it was discovered that firing produced a hard watertight vessel. In process of time, forms of vessels have become more and more specialised, according to use for storing food and beverages etc. or for ornament, and manufacture has become much automated.


