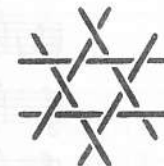

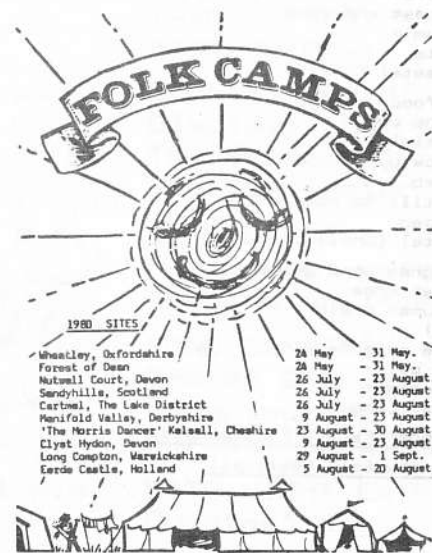

FESTIVAL NOTES

Song organiser Dev Deverill reports:

"Singer and whistle-player extraordinary VIN GARBUTT hails from Teesside - was a huge hit at last year's Sidmouth Festival and we're lucky to have him with us... PYEWACKETT are a five-piece band who cover everything from Playford to Roy Fox - 'a most melodious twang'... GRAHAM & EILEEN PRATT are a versatile duo from Gloucester, who record on the Cottage label... HOLLINMOR are a four-part close-harmony group from Devon, well known at West Country festivals... WHITE COCKADE are a three-piece traditional folk-song group, resident at South Petherton's own Bell Folk Club ... NIGEL CHIPPINDALE was 'the find' of our 1979 festival, a talented multi-instrumentalist from Yorkshire... CURATE'S EGG are nationally known for their hour-long performances of music, songs and poems on specific themes; don't miss their 'Supernatural' anthology at Friday's Late Night Extra [by season ticket only; sorry!] ... Look out for ANDY CARD, the meanest button-box player around... MR BOB WALKER is not only town crier for Dorchester-with-Sherborne, but also honorary town crier of Charleston, South Carolina! ... No room to list everybody; just let me say that together with many fine local singers this lot will make our 1980 festival THE BIG ONE!"

Dance organiser Archie Bryden reports:

"HUGH RIPPON, formerly PRO for the EFDSS, one of the most popular callers in the country and an expert on the Morris, making his first visit... WOODFIDLEY, from Winchester, came to our first two festivals; they're well known for their high standard of dance-presentation; they show dances from all parts of the UK and will conduct a Manx workshop... DAVID SLATER, their leader, famous as caller and dancer; director of the Winchester Folk Festival... HURSLEY INTERNATIONAL DANCERS,

from the same area, coming for the second time to show dances from the Balkans, in authentic costumes and with exciting music... BRISTOL FASHION, regular supporters of our festival, showing English country dances and the long sword dances of Yorkshire... Their juniors, SHAMROCK DANCERS, are girls who enjoy showing the Irish tradition... BRIAN SALWAY, leader of Bristol Fashion, is a well known caller in and around Bristol and Bath... THE YETMINSTER IRISH DANCERS - coming once again fresh from appearances on BBC and HTV - made a great impression at Sidmouth in 1978; in constant demand at festivals and folk events... CHALICE MORRIS MEN from Highbridge are coming for the first time, and bringing their ladies, the CHESTNUT CLOGGIES, to present the traditional clog dances of the north-west... THE WESSEX MORRIS MEN, our local club, formed 1957, whose members come from many places between South Petherton and Portland, as last year will open the festival on Friday evening... BISHOPSWOOD CEILIDH CLUB are bringing their Mummers' Play for open-air performances throughout the Saturday, and on Sunday we welcome THE OLD VIC MUMMERS... THE WESTBURY SCOTTISH DANCERS brought a touch of the tartan to us in 1977 and 1978, with their vigorous presentation of the intricate dances from north of the Border... BOB PATTEN, author, collector of songs, stories and customs from Somerset, will give two illustrated talks; knows the county well, being a native of Ilminster... BUTTERFINGERS are a lively bunch of musicians who have regularly come to run our children's events; JOHN CHAPMAN, increasingly popular caller from Ilminster, has run the Hobby Horse Club with them... JIGS FOR GIGS, the local folk band, play for the Yetminster Irish and for ceilidhs throughout the south-west; recently on TV with the former... PENDRAGON, three talented players from Winchester, provide the music for Woodfidley... We also hope to hear from SPICE, a recorder ensemble based in the village; SPAM, a local

amateur folk band, and melodeon-player HUGH BLAKE ... and we shall certainly hear from American-born, Chard-based, piper JIM WOODS!"

NOT JUST HERE AND NOT JUST NOW!

Ours is only one among literally scores of folk festivals up and down the country. Some are huge like the Cambridge Festival recently featured on TV; most - like ours - are smaller, friendlier and less commercial. But they all have one thing in common. They're fun!

And it's not only at festivals that you can enjoy folk music, song and dance. There's something going on all the time.
