The challenges of the last 18 months have been huge, with many dark periods; but with the dedication of staff / board and volunteers, and financial support through South Somerset District Council and Arts Council England Cultural Recovery Fund, we have survived.

During the lockdown we capitalised on specific grants, to finally tackle some repair issues. Thanks to Garfield Weston Foundation, Bradford's Building Supplies, South Petherton Parish Council and The Company of Ironmongers, we completed a significant amount; but, as with most old buildings, the work is 'to be continued'......

Internally we tackled some repainting work, created a lively wall mural, re-fitted stage lighting and fixed a few kitchen leaks; and more will be done throughout this year.


